



National Poomsae Referee Regulations

(Effective from April 8, 2021)

(Next Review due by April 8, 2022)

THE REGULATIONS ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE NATIONAL POOMSAE REFEREES

1. Objective

These regulations are to efficiently oversee the Poomsae Refereeing within the British Taekwondo.

2. Administration

Administration of Referees shall fall under the sole jurisdiction of the British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Department.

3. Qualification

British Taekwondo shall grant the qualification of National Poomsae Referee to those who have successfully passed all the prerequisite tests and criteria deemed necessary by the Referee department.

4. New Classifications

The British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Department has decided to align classification with the terms used by the Sport Referee Department, World Taekwondo and proposed future coach qualifications. The new classifications will be Class 3, Class 2 and Class 1. Currently active (those who have officiated since the 1st January 2018) will be recognised as follows

Class C as Class 3

Class B as Class 2

Class A as Class 1

The Class P classification is not being brought forward as the minimum grade qualification for referees moving forward will be Kukkiwon 1st Dan. Existing Class P Referees will be encouraged to attend a Class 3 course on attaining 1st Dan.

5. National Poomsae Referee Course

The course shall be conducted by the British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Department. The following levels of qualification are available to those meeting all the requirements specified:

Class 1 Referees applying for an International Referee qualification seminar must be recommended by the Poomsae Referee Department.

For promotion, at least 6 (75% of the minimum requirement) experience points must be gained by judging at competitions. The additional points may be accrued through participation in courses, seminar, etc as shown below.

Note: Qualifications expire after 2 years of issue if a Referee is inactive.

6. Experience Points

The following types of event will be recognised for the award of as referee experience.

Referee Refresher course	1 Point

WT/WTE Referee workshops	1 Point (Evidence required of completion)
Overseas International competition	2 Points
British National Championships	2 points for two days, 1 point for one day judging
Half Day judging will be awarded	0.5 Points

Qualified Referees officiating at an event but unable to referee due to other duties will receive 1/0.5 points at the sole discretion of the Poomsae Referee Department.

Note: One to one competitions are not recognised for referee experience.

14. Practical Poomsae Test

The Practical Poomsae Test is included in the assessment to demonstrate the candidate's knowledge and understanding of the poomsae. It is not an assessment of the quality of performance. Candidates are expected to be able to demonstrate this understanding by performing the poomsae without major (0.3 deduction) errors.

15. Review Process

Unsuccessful candidates will be entitled to have their assessment reviewed. They should request a review by email to the Chair of the Poomsae Referee Department within four weeks of receiving the result from their course. A review fee of £25 will be required, and if the candidate's result is reversed this fee will be refunded.

If the candidate is requesting a review of their Practical Poomsae Test, they will be required to submit videos of all the assessment poomsae with their payment.

The review will be undertaken by a Qualified Chief Referee who was not involved in the original assessment. The result of the review will be sent to the candidates within two weeks of request for a review being received by the Poomsae Referee Department. The decision will be final, and no further review will be permitted.

16. Activation

Those who passed the examination at the National Referee course shall be automatically registered with the British Taekwondo Referee Department as a Referee.

British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Department shall send certificates to successful candidates.

17. Referee Uniform

The National Referee Uniform is composed of:

- Navy jacket and light grey trousers.
- White shirt.
- A British Taekwondo National Referee tie.
- White sports shoes.

18. Referee Remuneration

Details of the referee remuneration requirements are documented in the 2021 Poomsae Referee Remuneration Policy.

19. Selection and Assignment

Invitations of referees to domestic events other than those directly organised by British Taekwondo shall be the responsibility of event Organising Committees working with event's Chief Referee. The selection and assignment

of National Referees for the events organised by British Taekwondo shall be conducted by the Poomsae Referee Department.

For events sanctioned by World Taekwondo and World Taekwondo Europe, such as the European Championships, invitations will be issued by WT, WTE and hosting MNAs. The hosting bodies shall inform the Poomsae Referee Department of the selected referees for prior approval.

National / International Referees invited to international championships must inform the Referee Director & Referee Department for approval one month before the event.

20. Transfer from other MNA

The following process will apply to referees transferring from other World Taekwondo Member National Associations.

National Referees: Referee should provide the British Taekwondo Referee Director with a CV and all certificates from their previous MNA. The Referee Director will then have sole discretion to assign an appropriate initial classification.

International Referees relocating to the UK: Referees will be recognised by British Taekwondo and eligible to participate in all events. The referee will be expected to demonstrate their support to British Taekwondo during their first year of membership. If this is deemed satisfactory after review by the British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Department they will then be eligible to apply for the Chief Referee Qualification or to be a British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Tutor.

International Referees qualifying through other MNAs: Recommendation for the IR Course will be through the British Taekwondo Referee Department with approval by the British Taekwondo CEO. Referees who bypass this process by seeking recognition by other routes undermine the development pathway. The referee will not be eligible to participate in the Chief Referee Qualification training or apply to be a British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee Tutor for two years. After two years, their contribution to domestic events will be evaluated by the Poomsae Referee Department and if satisfactory this restriction will be removed.

21. Duty

Duties of a British Taekwondo Poomsae Referee

- The National Poomsae Referee shall abide by all the Poomsae Rules with pride and dignity as the National Referee of the British Taekwondo.
- The National Referee shall be familiar with the Competition Rules and guiding principles concerned.
- The National Referee shall officiate at any Taekwondo events without partiality in consideration of the fact that decisions made by the National Referee shall be conclusive.

22. Regulations

- a) The Referees shall officiate at Taekwondo events with impartiality.
- b) The Referees shall wear the uniform designated by the British Taekwondo before officiating at the events.
- c) The Referee shall make every effort to ensure that there will be no unnecessary delay of a match because of his or her officiating.
- d) Referees who have been selected to officiate at any official event of British Taekwondo must participate in the event unless there is prior notice of a justifiable reason for absence. Referees are required to attend the referees' meeting and training before the start of the competition.
- e) Sufficient time for preparation and participation will be provided to Class 2 and 3 referees who are competing in a championship.
- f) On satisfactory completion of their services, referees will receive appropriate experience points.
