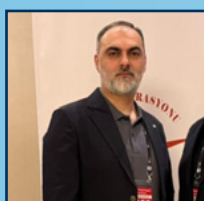

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PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

All competitors must be:

- Members of British Taekwondo at the point of registration and on the time of the competition
- UK passport holders **OR** residents in the United Kingdom (including Crown Dependencies and Overseas Territories)

Every club that enters competitors must have a valid Welfare Officer on **My Club Hub**.

Coaches

To be eligible to coach, coaches must meet all of the following requirements:

Welfare Officers

Every club that enters athletes must have a Licensed Welfare Officer recorded on **My Club Hub**.

Competitors must enter the division that reflects their grade on the day of the competition. Any competitors competing in an incorrect division will be disqualified immediately and further sanctions may be applied to the instructor or club.		

All competitors will compete in their 2026 age division.

Age categories are based on the year of birth. For example, if a player is 17 years old on the day of the competition but will turn 18 before the end of the calendar year (2026) then the player will participate in the U30 category (18 - 30 years old).

Players can enter a maximum of one recognised individual, one para poomsae individual, one pair and one team PLUS additional Freestyle PLUS additional Family (pair and team) divisions.

The relevant eligibility must be met for each division.

Multiple Individual Division Entries

Para poomsae competitors are permitted to enter recognised divisions on the basis that they will be scored using recognised scoring criteria, with no adaptations or adjustment based on impairment.

They compete in all divisions as full competitors and can be awarded medals and score team points. Athletes entering a Para Poomsae division and a Recognised Poomsae division must pay the full initial entry fee for both divisions, followed by any applicable additional division fees.

Teams must have 5 competitors, with at least two competitors of each sex (male/female).

All freestyle divisions will compete according to the latest WT rules.

Freestyle poomsae is technically demanding and carries an increased risk of injury.

It is the responsibility of coaches and competitors to ensure they can perform the compulsory requirements of freestyle routines safely.

- Performances shall be 90 - 100 seconds
- Music to be supplied by competitors in MP3 or MP4 format.
- Music cannot be supplied through streaming services or YouTube.
- Music cannot contain any lyrics.
- Music must be submitted by email no later than Wednesday 28th October to events@britishtaekwondo.org

Freestyle competitors must also bring a physical storage device (e.g memory stick) with their music to the event.

Family Divisions

Family Divisions will once again feature in the British Taekwondo National Poomsae Championships and will contribute to the overall team scores.

There will be Family divisions for pairs and teams in Kup, Dan, and mixed grades (see table below).

- At least two generations are required for a family pair or team.
For example, parent/child, grandparent/grandchild. Any combination of generations is allowed, but must be direct relations, e.g. grandparent, parents, and children - not aunts/uncles/cousins.
- One participation per family only is allowed.
For example, choose **ONE** from:
Kup Team, Kup Pair, Mixed team, Mixed Pair, Dan Team or Dan Pair
- There are no age limits or gender restrictions for family divisions
- Poomsae can be freely selected.
- All family divisions are direct to a final using the cutoff scoring method.
- Two different Poomsae must be performed from the recognised Poomsae.

Para Poomsae competitors who do not have a confirmed World Para Taekwondo International Sport Classification must complete and submit the Medical Diagnostic Form and send it to disability@britishtaekwondo.org and para.poomsae@britishtaekwondo.org with any supporting documents before Friday 4th September.

The documentation will be reviewed for indicative eligibility, and the athlete will be contacted to advise the provisional Sport Class.

For **B-Class** competitors there is a free choice of two different poomsae from the poomsae range. B-Class competitors may not repeat the same poomsae in the same round.

If there is more than one round of competition (e.g., a semi-final and final), all competitors may repeat their poomsae from the previous round.

Payment Instructions

Entry fees that are not paid by Wednesday 7th October will be charged at a higher rate per the table above.

Any team or individual that does not complete full payment by Thursday 15th October 2026 will be removed from the system.

Refunds

All entry fees are non-refundable except in the case of withdrawal on medical grounds.

Players who withdraw from competition on medical grounds must request a withdrawal and provide evidence of the injury or medical condition, provided by a medical professional, to events@britishtaekwondo.org within 10 working days of the event.

After 10 working days no refunds will be approved.

COACH ACCREDITATION

Coach accreditation must be collected in person and can only be handed out to the named coach. Coaches and athletes cannot collect accreditation on behalf of another coach.

Every additional 5-players will gain 1 additional free coach pass.	

Additional coaching passes may be purchased for £25 each. Clubs should register additional coaches above the quota of free coach passes on the entry system.

British Taekwondo will send an invoice by email at the end of the registration period for any additional passes that require payment.

Coaches will only be permitted at courtside if they have an athlete competing.

Coaches must wear sportswear and sports shoes. Coaches must not wear Taekwondo uniforms, sandals, flip flops, shorts, or headwear whilst coaching, except for head coverings for religious or cultural reasons.



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METHOD OF COMPETITION

- All Dan and K1 divisions will use a combination of cut-off and single elimination
 - Cut off system will be used to reach top 8 competitors
 - Then single elimination will be used to determine top 8 placings
 - Results of cut off system will be used to seed competitors for single elimination
 - Divisions with 8 or fewer competitors will use single elimination without seeding
 - Individual Dan and K1 divisions will use side-by-side single elimination
 - Pair and Team Dan and K1 divisions will use one-at-a-time single elimination
 - As the competition will run under World Taekwondo single elimination format, Poomsae will be drawn courtside prior to the start of each match.
- All K2 and K3, Para, Freestyle and Family divisions will use the Cut off system.
 - Preliminary: 20 or more competitors.
 - Semi-final: 9-19 competitors, or 50% from 1st round.
 - Final: Top 8 competitors. Groups with 9 competitors progress to a straight final

Organisers have the right to make necessary changes.

Compulsory Poomsae

As the competition will using hybrid competition method any Dan or K1 divisions with a preliminary and/or semi-final round will have the compulsory poomsae for these rounds published on Wednesday 28th October.

The compulsory poomsae will be distributed as follows:

- Published on the British Taekwondo website [here](#)
- Sent by email to the club instructors and coaches who registered players (ensure the correct email address is used)
- A link will be posted on the WhatsApp channel
- Published on British Taekwondo social media channels.

Competitors may be asked to perform any of the Poomsae from their set list in the order listed in the Compulsory Poomsae.

Two Poomsae will be performed in each round.

Single Elimination: the Poomsae required for the competing players will be announced on court immediately before the match starts. (Only applies to finals of Dan and K1 divisions).

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THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTION (TUE)

Competitors who require a TUE for prohibited medication must complete the application and submit a copy to UK Anti-Doping before the event.

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DOPING CONTROL

British Taekwondo and its members are subject to the World Anti-Doping Code and the list of prohibited substances and methods in force at the time of the event. Doping control may be undertaken at random.

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MEDALS AND AWARDS

Individual Medals

1st (Gold), 2nd (Silver), 3rd (Bronze) and 4th (Bronze) place awards will be presented in each category.

Individual awards will be presented on the mat by the referees immediately after the division final. A podium and backdrop will be available for photographs outside the field of play.

Team Awards

Team awards will be presented each day for Dan competition, Kup competition, and Para competition.

An Overall Best Team trophy for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams will be presented at the end of the second day.

Team awards are calculated based on points accumulated by players representing clubs.

- If there is a tie in overall team points, the most gold medals will win.
- If there is a tie after gold medal count, the team with the lowest number of competitors will win.

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UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT

Dan Grades

Dan grade (black belt, aged 15 and over) participants must wear the correct Dan poomsae dobok, or a plain black V-neck dobok with a dan belt.

Poom Grades

Poom grade (black belt, aged under 15) participants must wear a Poom poomsae dobok or a plain Poom dobok with a poom belt.

Kup Grades

Kup grade participants must wear a white dobok with plain white V-neck collar (not black or poom) and the correct belt for their grade.

Incorrect Uniform

Participants wearing incorrect uniform will be permitted to compete but will receive a score deduction by the referees under presentation of the poomsae.

Official British Taekwondo Poomsae Performance 'GBR' doboks are NOT permitted.

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PROTESTS

Any protest must be made by the club coach by completing an official protest form within 10 minutes of the end of the contest, to the Competition Supervisory Board.

The protest fee is £75 (refunded if the protest is successful).

In accordance with World Taekwondo rules protests may only be made about procedural errors, not about scoring.



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LIABILITY

All competitors are participating at their own risk. British Taekwondo assumes no responsibility for any damages, injuries, or losses.

By submitting a competitor or coach application you are confirming that you are fit and able to take part in this competition and do not suffer from any illness or condition that would prevent you from taking part.

First-aid medical cover will be in place throughout the competition.

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SPECTATORS

Purchasing tickets

Tickets will only be available for sale online and can be ordered before the event, or when you arrive by scanning the QR code posters before entering the arena.

Competitors and coaches do not require spectator tickets; their accreditation provides access to the full weekend of competition.

Children aged 4 and below do not require a ticket.

Companion passes will be available on the door and do not require pre-booking; these are intended for people to support spectators or athletes with disabilities. There is no charge for a companion pass.

The British Taekwondo National Poomsae Championships is a family friendly event with a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of abuse. Verbal abuse of any kind, towards event & venue staff, officials and competing teams is unacceptable. Taekwondo values expect people to be respectful whilst enjoying participating in, and supporting at, events. The venue also has a zero-tolerance policy with regards to poor behaviour and people will be asked to leave the venue if found to be abusing others.

Trams run from the train station to the University campus every 10 minutes. The journey lasts 14 minutes. The stop is 'Toton Lane' to 'University Boulevard'. University Boulevard is a 14-minute walk to the competition venue through the campus.

By car

Use postcode NG7 2QE to reach the West Entrance to University Park Campus.

Parking

There is free parking available at David Ross Sports Village, including eight accessible parking spaces for blue-badge permit holders, and the surrounding Beeston Lane during the competition weekend.
