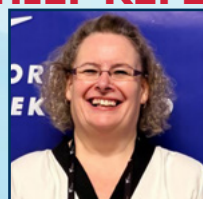

Daily Schedule & Running Order

Matches will commence at 0900 on both days of competition.

Courts will close on a rolling basis for a 45-minute lunch break from 1200. Announcements will be made on the day to confirm the time and final matches before the lunch break.

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

All competitors must be:

- Members of British Taekwondo at the point of registration and on the time of the competition
- UK passport holders **OR** residents in the United Kingdom (including Crown Dependencies and Overseas Territories)

If you have any issues with membership, please ask your club coach/ instructor to contact British Taekwondo membership services on membership.services@britishtaekwondo.org or call **0161 697 5330**

Competitors must bring and show PHOTO identification at weigh in.

Acceptable forms of photo ID include up to date GAL/GOL cards, government issued identification such as passport, driving licence or other government recognised forms of photographic ID (e.g. Citizen Card). Library cards, bus passes and student cards are not accepted forms of ID.

The organiser reserves the right to accept or reject any forms of identification at its discretion.

Coaches

To be eligible to coach, coaches must meet all of the following requirements:

- Minimum age: 18 years old on the day of the competition
- hold a current British Taekwondo Membership
- hold a valid Coach Licence, which requires:
 - A valid disclosure check (DBS, PVG, Access NI) accessible by British Taekwondo

Coach accreditation will only be issued if the coach's membership information is completed in full online before the end of the registration period. Once the registration deadline has passed no further coaches will be added to the system.

Coaches must bring and show PHOTO identification at registration to collect coach passes and team packs. Acceptable forms of photo ID include up to date GAL/GOL cards, government issued identification such as passport or driving licence.

Coach accreditation must be collected in person and can only be handed out to the named coach. Coaches and athletes cannot collect accreditation on behalf of another coach.

Technical Officials

All referees and judges present at the event will be appropriately qualified and have passed the audit checks required by British Taekwondo.

Invitations to express an interest in participating in this event will be sent to all qualifying referees by the British Taekwondo Sport Referee Department.

Welfare Officers

Every club that enters athletes must have a Licensed Welfare Officer recorded on **My Club Hub**. The Welfare Officer does not need to attend the British Taekwondo National Kyorugi Championships in person.

To be eligible to act as Welfare Officer, you must meet all of the following requirements:

- Minimum age: 18 years old on the day of the competition
- hold a current British Taekwondo Membership

Advanced Divisions

- Pee Wee, Child and Cadet match time: 3 x rounds of 1 minute and 30 seconds.
- Junior and Senior match time: 3 x rounds of 2 minutes
- As per WT rules, semi-finals and finals of all Senior divisions will have no point gap. Point gap will apply for all other divisions.
- There will be no merging of weight categories under any conditions. If there is only one athlete in a division that athlete will win the division and be awarded the gold medal.

SUNDAY 4TH OCTOBER

Novice Divisions

- All matches on Sunday will be 3 x rounds of 1 minute 30 seconds, including finals.
- 15-point gap rule will apply in all finals.
- There will be no merging of weight categories under any conditions. If there is only one athlete in a division that athlete will win the division and be awarded the gold medal.

Novice Eligibility

If a player meets any of the following criteria they are **not** eligible to compete as a Novice:

- Has historically competed at British Taekwondo National Championships 3 or more times (Excluding Pee Wee)
- Has won gold twice at British Taekwondo National Kyorugi Championships (Excluding Pee Wee)
- Has participated in or been invited to the GB Taekwondo Talent Draft Phase 2, or has been selected for GB Taekwondo development team (Athletes who have only attended Phase 1 of the GB Taekwondo Talent Draft and have not been invited to Phase 2 are still eligible to compete as Novices)
- Kyorugi GAL Card Holder
- Holds a Black Belt **OR** has competed internationally in any other martial art (e.g. Kickboxing, ITF, Karate etc), irrelevant of Taekwondo grade.

If any of the above apply but you are between 9th – 3rd Kup – you must compete in an Advanced category **regardless of your belt grade.**

PSS PROVISION AND SENSOR SOCKS

KPNP Electronic Body Protector systems, headguards and e-gloves will be provided by British Taekwondo for all matches on both days.

All matches in every division on both days of competition will use K2 PSS.

KPNP K2 sensor socks will be available to hire for **all Novice age groups** and Advanced Pee Wee, Child and Cadet age groups, these will be available when athletes check in for their match at a cost of £5 per match.

Athletes in all other age groups must provide their own KPNP K2 sensor socks. If you do not have these socks, please contact Ki Martial Arts on **01752 251 745** before Friday 31st July to pre-order for the British Taekwondo National Kyorugi Championships.

Ki Martial Arts will also have KPNP K2 sensor socks available to buy on competition days on a first-come, first-served basis

Face shields are mandatory for all Para Taekwondo matches in accordance with World Para Taekwondo rules. These will be provided by British Taekwondo.

REGISTRATIONS

Registration Link

All registrations are to be made online at Martial Events: **[ENTER HERE](#)**

The email address you register with is the email address we will use to communicate with you. Please ensure that you use the correct email address for your club when registering.

Coaches are responsible for ensuring their players weight and entry details are correct. No refunds will be given should any player be disqualified or not wish to pay the administration fee to move weight groups.

All information must be entered when registering players. Registrations without membership numbers and all other required information will be removed from the system.

Please note, any club that has players remaining in the online system at the deadline will be responsible for paying the full entry fee even if that player does not compete.

WEIGHT CHANGES

If a player is unable to make weight, they can change division on the day of the weigh in. Changes to weight division must be made in line with World Taekwondo rules for bodyweight divisions.

All weight changes after the entry closing date must be made at the weigh in and are subject to a £25 administration fee payable by card or contactless payment at the weigh in.

Where possible every club should have at least one coach present during weigh in to support players and liaise with referees and organisers.

OPENING AND CLOSING DATES

The entry portal for all categories will open at 1200 midday on Monday 27th July 2026
The entry portal will close at 1200 midday on Monday 14 September 2026

There is no cap on entry numbers for this event.

Players can be registered at any time during the registration process. Therefore coaches and instructors should only register players who will definitely compete at the event, and ensure that all entry information is completed in full.

After the closing date, a waiting list will be available for late entrants. Joining the waiting list does not guarantee a place in the competition.

COACH ACCREDITATION

All coaches must register online prior to the deadline date. All information must be given online, or coaches will be removed from the system.

Every additional 5-players will gain 1 additional free coach pass.	

Additional coaching passes may be purchased for £25 each. Clubs should register additional coaches above the quota of free coach passes on the entry system. British Taekwondo will send an invoice by email at the end of the registration period for any additional passes that require payment. The balance for additional coach passes must be paid within 7-days of the end of the registration period, or the additional coaches will be removed from the system.

Additional coach passes cannot be purchased at the event.

Coaches will only be permitted at courtside if they have an athlete competing. Coaches may only attend court at the coach positions and must leave the field of play immediately at the end of the match.

Only coaches can be courtside during the event. All players must immediately leave the field of play following completion of their match.

Coaches must wear appropriate attire – refer to section 4.3 of the British Taekwondo Field of Play (FOP) Protocol policy.

Misuse of Accreditation

Accreditation is only valid for the individual whose name and image are on the accreditation pass. Any person found using an accreditation pass other than their own will be ejected from the event immediately and the pass will be confiscated and destroyed.

Any person found in an area their accreditation pass does not permit them to enter will have their pass confiscated and may be asked to leave the event.

Any person without accreditation found in an area that requires accreditation will be asked to leave the event.

Athletes competing on Sunday can weigh in on Friday or Saturday. If they weigh in on Friday, they do not need to weigh in again on Saturday.

Drawing of Lots

The drawing of lots for Saturday's weight groups will take place immediately after the weigh-in closes at 8pm on Friday 2nd October.

The drawsheets for Saturday will be published and sent to coaches from 9pm onwards.

Coaches should pay particular attention to those athletes competing in the first few matches on each court and ensure they are at the venue in good time to warm up and prepare.

A further drawing of lots for Sunday's weight groups will take place at the venue on Saturday at approximately 5pm following the completion of the weigh-in.

The drawsheets for Sunday will be published and sent to coaches after competition has finished on Saturday.

Random weigh in will take place for Advanced Cadet/Junior/Senior age categories excluding + weight categories. Random weigh in will follow World Taekwondo protocol:

No. of athletes	Amount selected for Random weigh in
>32	20% of total Athletes
17 - 32	6 Athletes
9 - 16	4 Athletes
4 - 8	2 Athletes
<4	0 Athletes

Random weigh in will last for 30-minutes and will take place between 0800-0830 on Saturday 3rd October at the competition venue

COMPETITION RULES

World Taekwondo Competition Rules will be applied as per the new rules adopted 1st June 2026 for all able-bodied divisions.

World Para Taekwondo Competition Rules will be applied as per the new rules adopted 11th April 2026 for all Para Taekwondo divisions.

COACH/HEAD OF TEAM MEETING

An online Coach / Head of Team meeting will take place on **Tuesday 29 September**.

The time and joining instructions will be sent to all coaches registered for the event after the entry deadline.

The meeting is not mandatory but highly encouraged. The meeting will be recorded and sent by email to all registered coaches.

DOPING CONTROL

British Taekwondo and its members are subject to the World Anti-Doping Code and the list of prohibited substances and methods in force at the time of the event.

Doping control may be undertaken at random.

MEDALS AND AWARDS

Individual Medals

Awards will be presented to all tournament Champions (Gold), 2nd Place (Silver) and 2 x 3rd places (Bronze) per category.

Team Awards

Team trophies will be presented to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Place teams each day for Advanced competition, Novice competition and Para competition.

An Overall Best Team trophy for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place team will be presented at the end of the second day.

Team awards are calculated based on points accumulated by players representing clubs.

1st Place	9 points
2nd Place	6 points
3rd Place	3 points

If there is a tie in overall team points, the number of gold medals will be considered.



UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT

Uniforms and Protective Equipment

All athletes must wear World Taekwondo recognised uniforms and protective equipment.

A list of companies which supply WT recognised protective equipment can be found [on the WT website](#)

Mouthguard (also called Gum Shield)

- Colour: limited to "WHITE" or "TRANSPARENT" only
- At least 3mm thick
- It is mandatory to always wear a mouthguard. There is no exception.

Athlete without brace

- Must wear at least a full upper mouthguard.
- Custom-made mouthguard by dentist is the best for safety.

Athletes with braces

- Athletes with braces MUST consult their dentist for customized mouthguard(s) before participating in competition.
- Any athlete with brace(s) must follow one of below options:
 1. Double mouthguard for braces (which covers both upper and lower teeth and braces) : This gives the best protection => Strongly recommended
 2. Full upper mouth guard for brace AND partial coverage lower mouthguard for brace (which covers at least 6 teeth) => Still safe. It is allowed to use (2) if the athletes have severe breathing problem.

Jewellery and piercings

All jewellery & piercings must be removed before athletes arrive at the inspection desk as this causes substantial delays to matches when athletes need to remove them at inspection. We ask all coaches to ensure their athletes remove items beforehand. Athletes may miss or forfeit their match if they cannot meet competition rules.

False nails and eyelashes

All acrylic nails & false eyelashes including extensions must be removed before athletes arrive at the inspection desk as this causes substantial delays to matches and the inspection area when athletes have to remove them.

We ask all coaches to ensure their athletes remove items beforehand. Athletes may miss or forfeit their match if they cannot meet competition rules.

Inspection

All contestants will be required to proceed to the inspection desk before entering the competition area. At inspection Officials will check the uniform and protective equipment, presence of any jewellery, piercing, false nails and lashes. Any contestant wearing non-recognised or approved equipment, or other items not permitted in the field of play will not be permitted to compete.

APPEALS

Instant Video replay (IVR) will be used for all matches on all courts throughout the tournament.

The IVR provider will be ReStrike and will use 2 cameras per court.

PROTESTS

Protests will be available for the event. Protests will cost £200; this is non-refundable and taken as cash or card payments with a receipt provided. The protest procedure will be in line with World Taekwondo rules.

LIABILITY

All competitors are participating at their own risk. British Taekwondo assumes no responsibility for any damages, injuries or losses.

By submitting a competitor or coach application you are confirming that you are fit and able to take part in this competition and do not suffer from any illness or condition that would prevent you from taking part.

First aid medical cover will be in place throughout the competition.

IDENTIFICATION

All competitors and coaches must bring photographic identification to registration / weigh in. Unfortunately, any competitor or coach who fails to produce photo ID for inspection may not be able to take part in the competition. This is at the full discretion of the competition organisers.

ENTRY FEES, PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

Entry Fees and Payment

Entry fees must be paid at the point of entry to secure a place at the competition. If the entry fee is unpaid the entry is invalid. Every Friday during the entry period British Taekwondo will review the entry list and remove all entries that have not been paid for.

Entry fees can be paid the club, or by the individual players.

Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organiser and may not be accepted if the competition overall, or specific divisions are at capacity.

Refunds

All entry fees are non-refundable except in the case of withdrawal on medical grounds.

Players who withdraw from the competition on medical grounds must request a withdrawal and send evidence of the injury or medical condition, provided by a medical professional, to events@britishtaekwondo.org within 10 working days of the end of the event.

After 10 working days, no refunds will be approved.

Transfers

All entry fees are non-transferable; they apply to one specific individual athlete and cannot be transferred to another athlete.



SPECTATORS

Online members-only tickets

To access specially discounted tickets for British Taekwondo members, you will need to enter your British Taekwondo membership number at the checkout when purchasing your tickets. This will then automatically apply the correct discount.

Purchasing tickets

Tickets will only be available for sale online and can be ordered before the event, or when you arrive by scanning the QR code posters before entering the arena.
